

## ✧ITINERARY✧

Picked up from hotel.

Drive east bounded for 1 hour to the UNESCO World Heritage Site “*Terra-cotta Army Museum*”, which is also regarded as the 8<sup>th</sup> wonder of the world. In this museum, there are over 8000 pieces of life-size, life-like terra-cotta warriors and horses standing underground for over 2000 thousand years to protect the after-life of China’s first unifier – Emperor Qin Shi Huang(259BC-210BC). The museum was opened in 1979 and now is composed of 4 subterranean pits housing over 8000 pieces of terra-cotta warriors and horses, and 1 separate museum housing a pair of half life size bronze chariots and horses, which are the largest and most exquisite bronze ware discovered in China.

Visit of this museum will take you 2 to 2.5hrs around.

Lunch: Qin Restaurant or similar

In the afternoon, visit the nearby *Huaqing Hot Springs*, a complex of hot springs located at the foot of Li Shan Mountain. It was built in 723AD in the Tang Dynasty as part of the Huaqing Palace that was the winter palace for the famous royal couple Emperor Xuan Zong and his favorite consort Yang Guifei. Huaqing Hot Springs is also the site of 1936 Xian Incident, when Chiang Kai-shek was kidnapped by former warlord Zhang Xueliang and forced to join in the Chinese Communist Party to oppose the invasion by Japanese during the 2<sup>nd</sup> world war.

After the tour, drive for one hour back to hotel
